The history of the modern city of Oberhausen can be traced back to the water castle in Holten – today a district of Oberhausen – which was first mentioned in historic documents in 1188. While it all began as a countryside village, in the 18th century the city became an important spot in Germany due to industrialization and mining, especially of iron ore at the beginning and coal later on.







In 1897, the first German city tram started running in Oberhausen, and it became home to the first new theater after World War II in the Ruhr Valley. Over the last 100 years, Oberhausen kept adding new and newer leisure attractions. By now, Oberhausen became one of the most entertaining and worth-to-live-in places in western Germany and features a great variety of attractions of all sorts from culture to sports and tourism and much in between. The stylish and very modern Parkhotel in Oberhausen can actually look back on a more than 100-year history, being founded as a simple restaurant in 1906 by Bernhard Wischermann under the name "Zur Bockmuehle".
